Are solar panels a scam?

That is, of course, also a scam. To protect yourself from clean energy scams: Know that "free" or "no cost" solar panel offers are scams. The federal government does not install solar systems in homes for free. If you're considering whether solar energy is right for you, check out the Department of Energy's guide for homeowners and learn more.

How do you know if a solar system is a scam?

Ask for a list of satisfied customers and look at customer reviews online. Know that the government won't offer you free solar. The federal government does not install residential solar panels for free; if someone is claiming otherwise, it's probably a scam. If it seems too good to be true, it probably is.

What are energy scams?

Energy scams involve people pretending to be energy companies or regulators to get your money or personal information. These scammers may pretend to be your energy company, say they're from Ofgem or even from Energy Saving Trust to try and gain your trust.

What should I do if a solar business is a scam?

Protect your personal information. Don't respond to unexpected requests online or on social media for your name, address, or other personal information to "see if you qualify." At best, this is someone generating leads to sell, not actual solar businesses. At worst, they're scammers trying to steal your identity.

How common are cold call solar panels?

See our solar panel brand reviews. This was by far the most common cold call solar panel owners told us about - 44% have been approached about this. Technical faults with solar panels are rare. Nearly seven in 10 of those in our survey have not had a fault with their system. Some have owned theirs for more than a decade.

Are home solar panels a good idea?

Home solar panels can help some households save money on energy-- but be careful if a solar panel salesperson knocks on your door or calls without warning. There are plenty of reputable companies who can install solar panels or help you make other clean energy improvements to your home.
